The series includes both anthologies and monographs and is published open access in digital formats with an option for purchasing a print-on-demand edition. Art and Culture in Education publishes research on topics related to art and culture within the context of the educational process at all levels, from kindergarten and school, to teacher training. The aim of the series is to promote new subject-specific, cross-disciplinary and interdisciplinary research, as well as developmental work in, for example, arts and crafts, music, dance, film, literature, drama and theatre, in an effort to inspire dialogue and cooperation between professional and research environments and fields of practice on key issues and current topics. The series has an open submission policy and welcomes proposals for scientific anthologies and monographs that explore art and cultural topics. Proposals are assessed by the series' editorial board, and members of the editorial board can act as coeditor(s) on publications. All publications are subject to double-blind peer review. Art and Culture in Education is ranked a 'level 1' publishing channel in the Norwegian Register of scientific publication channels, and books in the series are published mainly with CC BY ND licence. A contribution (chapter) in the series receives 1 publication point the system.

Publisher

Submission and quality assessment

The writing series is open to all submissions and proposals for anthologies and monographs. Proposals with themes related to art and culture in education are sent at an early stage in the writing process by e-mail to the editor, with an attached project description in Word format. In collaboration with the publisher, it is the editorial board that decides whether the project is accepted.

The publication language in the writing series is Norwegian, but it is also possible to publish articles in other Scandinavian languages and in English. All submitted proposals must be designed in accordance with the guidelines for submitting project descriptions and scripts. (See above)

Art and culture in education practices double blind peer review. Before the peer review process is started, the contribution is assessed by the editor and editorial board. Once the peer review process has been completed, it is the editor(s) responsible for the manuscript who makes the final decision on publication of the articles.

All submitted manuscripts are sent to plagiarism control via iThenticate before possible publication.

Copyright and open access guidelines (Open Access)

All content of the series Art and culture in education is published open access.

The authors retain copyright and publication rights for their articles. Authors are permitted and encouraged to post their articles on personal and/or institutional websites after publication. The authors can also archive their articles in institutional science archives or archives linked to financial funds to ensure greater public access and availability in the future as well. The authors can also post *pre- print* versions of their articles on institution-based websites or other storage locations, provided that all bibliographic information is provided. Supplementary material should also be included when applicable.

Publication fee

Publication of peer-reviewed articles with open access in this series requires a publication fee (article processing charge, APC). Each individual author covers the cost of their article by

applying for a grant from the publication fund of the institution to which the author is affiliated or through alternative support schemes.

The total cost will be invoiced to the author(s) after the article has been published.
